


BLOCK OF THE MONTH August 2013

NAME: Carrie Nation

SIZE: 8-1/2" x 8-1/2" unfinished



Fabric A: red printed fabric provided by CCQG – This is the medium pieces in the diagram


Fabric B: blue fabric provided by CCQG – This is the dark fabric in the diagram

(NOTE: Fabrics A and B are not cut to size so you will need to cut per directions below)

Fabric C: White on white print provided by you; this should be quilt shop quality fabric

FOR	CUT	MEASURE	NEED
Fabric A:	4	2 ½ " squares	4 squares
Fabric B:	8	1 ½ " squares	8 squares
Fabric C:	8	2 ½" squares	8 squares
	8	1 ½" squares	8 squares

1. Sew one 2 ½" square of red Fabric A to one 2 ½" square of white Fabric C. Repeat for all of the red squares.
2. Sew one blue Fabric B 1 ½" square to one white Fabric C 1 ½" square. Repeat for all of the blue squares.
3. Sew the one red and white square unit to another red and white square unit as shown in diagram. Repeat.
4. Sew one blue and white square unit to one white 2 ½" square as shown in diagram. Repeat for all the blue units.
5. Sew a red/white unit created in step 3 to one blue/white unit created in step 4. Repeat.
6. Sew the two units created in Step 5 together.



FYI: Carrie Amelia Moore Nation (1846-1911) was a noted activist in the Women's Temperance movement. Her

"hatchetation" period was brief but brought her national notoriety. She was for a time much in demand as a temperance lecturer; she also railed against fraternal orders, tobacco, foreign foods, corsets, skirts of improper length, and mildly pornographic art of the sort found in some barrooms of the time. She was an advocate of woman suffrage.
